TEACHER/PARENT COMMUNICATOR Each Monday your child will bring home their Teacher/Parent Communicator folder with tests, quizzes, and other class work from the previous week.* Please review the included papers with your child. This will keep you up-to-date with your child's progress. One side of the folder states "Return to School," and the other side states "Keep at Home." Please return the folder complete with the signature sheet stating that you have reviewed the contents of the folder with your child and with the items from the "Return to School" side. If you have any concerns about your child's progress, please contact me as soon as possible.

**If it is a short week, I may choose to send the previous week's work home the next week. ☺*

PROGRESS REPORT

Progress reports will be emailed monthly to your email address. This progress report will be in addition to your students quarterly report card and give their current grade averages in each subject.

SNACKS

LEAVING EARLY PROCEDURE

If for any reason your child must leave before dismissal, please stop by the office, and a staff member will notify me. If you call the office prior to your arrival, it will allow me to ensure your child is ready in a timely manner.

Students may bring a light snack and a drink for snack time. If they are not on disciplinary measures, they will be able to eat this snack after morning recess. Please do not send food that requires the use of utensils, the microwave, or any glass containers.

HOMEWORK

Your child will be assigned homework on most school days. Students may have a chance to complete some of this work throughout the day. **Any class work that is not finished IS then homework and MUST be completed by the next school day.** A student may be required to complete their homework during recess. All students will be required to have their homework sheets signed by a parent each night that homework is assigned and completed. Homework is sent home in the students' binder. Homework is collected each morning, graded and returned to the students. Students **do** receive a grade for homework. If a student fails to complete their homework more than two times during a school week, they are then eligible for detention.

PROJECTS

In addition to a few smaller projects, there are two larger projects that will be completed this year. Each student will complete a Nation Project. More information will be sent home in the coming weeks. Also, students will be writing a research paper during the last quarter of the school year. Most of this project is done in class.
